
A limited number of tickets will be available at the door the evening of the event.

Padre's Garden

- Mission San Antonio -

The Padre's Garden at Mission San Antonio was established in 1960 in memory of the late Marie Trescony. In its heyday the garden served as a setting for the annual Rose Festival and the Cutting of the Roses in January. People came from all over the central coast to take home cuttings from the mission's beautiful rose garden.

Over the years the garden fell into disrepair. Weeds grew and covered the prize rose bushes, masking the beauty that lay beneath. The lawns disappeared and the trees began to break



under the weight of their fruits. Recent efforts to restore the garden to its original grandeur have made much progress. The weeds have been removed, the lawns have been replanted and the original walk ways have been re-established. Much has been done to revive the garden's spirit so that it is able to welcome visitors, old and new, and invite them to spend time in its serene ambience. The garden now hosts wedding and baptism celebrations as well as other special gatherings. Mission San Antonio is a popular retreat center and people from all walks of life are able to utilize the garden for meditation and prayer.

Today the mission itself faces a restoration deadline to avoid closure. State laws mandate that all



unenforced masonry buildings be retrofitted by 2017 or be closed to public access. Funds from this year's event will go towards this huge undertaking and help ensure that the mission remains accessible to pilgrims who come from all over the world to experience its story.

Evening in the Garden 2010 offers a once in a lifetime opportunity to hear world renown classical guitarist Ray Reussner perform in the mission chapel. Ray is a former student of the legendary Andrés Segovia, who called Reussner "one of the most distinguished guitarists of today."
